The Levelland Police Department is dedicated to providing professional, proactive, and community-driven law enforcement services. Our mission is to protect and serve the residents of Levelland with integrity, accountability, and a commitment to excellence.

Our department operates 24 hours a day, 7 days a week, ensuring that public safety remains our top priority. The Levelland PD lobby is open to the public Monday through Friday from 8:00 AM to 5:00 PM, where residents can access a variety of services and assistance.

The department is comprised of twenty-seven dedicated full-time officers and fourteen civilian personnel who work together to support our mission.

The sworn structure of the department includes:

- Chief of Police
- Two Captains
- Patrol and CID Sergeants
- Detectives
- School Resource Officers
- Canine Handler
- Patrol Officers

At Levelland PD, we uphold core values: integrity, honesty, fairness, courage, and compassion. These values guide every decision we make, ensuring that we provide the highest level of service to those who call Levelland home.

The Levelland Police Department, like law enforcement agencies across the United States, utilizes the Federal Bureau of Investigation's (FBI) National Incident-Based Reporting System (NIBRS) to track and analyze crime trends within our community. NIBRS provides a more comprehensive and accurate method of crime reporting by documenting all offenses that occur during a single incident, rather than only the most serious crime.

For example, if a vehicle burglary results in a stolen wallet and the unauthorized use of a credit card, NIBRS reports both offenses separately—theft from a motor vehicle and credit card fraud—allowing for a clearer picture of crime in our area.

The following table provides a breakdown of 2024 NIBRS reportable offenses for the Levelland Police Department. This report also includes the crime rate per 1,000 residents, a standard measure used nationwide to assess crime trends.

Crime Rate per 1,000 Inhabitants: This figure represents the number of reportable offenses per 1,000 residents, offering an objective way to compare crime rates across different communities.

In 2024, compared to 2023:

- Crimes Against Persons increased by 1.38%
- Crimes Against Property decreased by 25.36%
- Crimes Against Society decreased by 29.36%

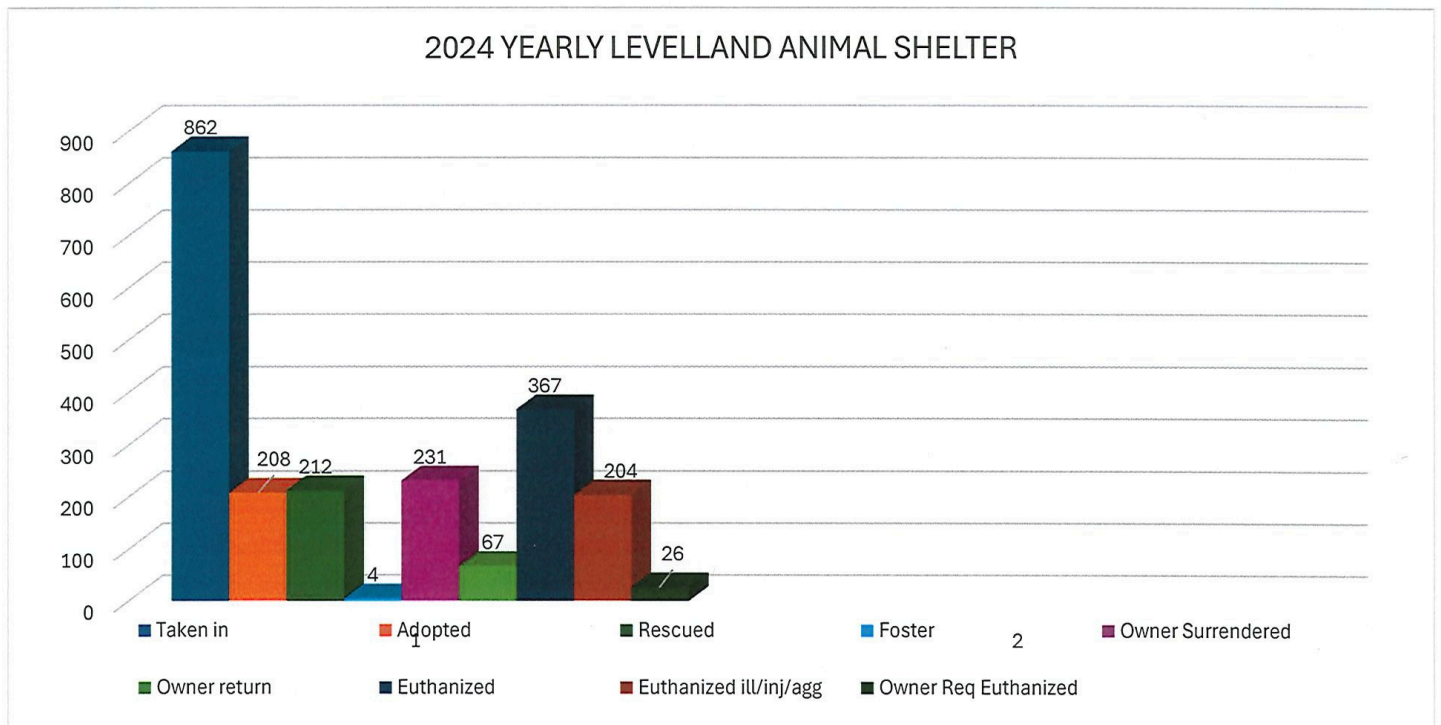

The Levelland Animal Control Division remained committed to the care and welfare of animals in our community throughout 2024. This year, we took in 862 animals, working diligently to find positive outcomes for as many as possible. Through our efforts and partnerships, 208 animals were adopted into loving homes, 212 were rescued by organizations, and 67 were successfully returned to their owners.
